An Emirates Concierge greets **BEN** at the new A380 terminal and is escorted to the dedicated Business Class check-in area. In just a couple of minutes, we've got a boarding pass and on the way to the Lounge, a great start, that gets even better. **BEN** was seated in 15A on the upper deck and was handed a glass of Veuve Clicquot French Champagne before take off.

#### THE SEAT

All are lie-flat. Duvets and pillows are provided. There's a compartment with mineral water and drinks, a stowage area for shoes, and personal items.
