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TCEB says biz as usual

and Exhibiton Bureau (TCEB) says its business as usual, with the country's MICE industry continuing to operate as normal following the wave of bombings that shook tourist destinations across the south late last week.

Prime Minister Prayut Chano-cha declared that security has been stepped up at key locations throughout Thailand as a preventative measure, and to ensure safety and security for business travellers and local residents

FOLLOWING on from last week's story about an outdoor Olympic pool at the Rio Games turning green, a second pool has now turned green and supposedly "smells like farts".

Olympic organisers admitted the "embarrassing" green water was the result of an unplanned dump of hydrogen peroxide into the water.

"This is a way of cleaning swimming pools but you're not supposed to combine it with chlorine," Gustabo Nascimento, Rio 2016's director of venue management told ABC.

To combat the murky waters (and the increasing number of swamp jokes), Rio organisers say the pools would need to be drained and the water replaced.

"As the government's flagship body for the MICE sector, TCEB is monitoring and assessing the business events situation and will be providing further details as the situation develops," the bureau said in a statement.

"In the meantime, TCEB would like to encourage business travellers to obtain information from various sources to get a balanced understanding about the reality of the situation in Thailand so they can plan their trips accordingly."

Adina to Macquarie

MACQUARIE Park in Sydney is set to receive an Adina Apartment Hotel, operated by TFE Hotels.

The 154-key property features a gym, bar, conference spaces and an infinity pool.

Located just steps away from Macquarie Park Station, construction of the newbuild has already begun, with a scheduled opening date of 2017.
