Sydney Int Art Series

TWO exhibitions have been secured for the Sydney International Art Series in 2016-2017 in Nov.

In a partnership between Tate, London and the Art Gallery of New South Wales, the series will see Nude: Art from the Tate Collection presented at the Art Gallery of New South Wales; and Tatsuo Miyajima will also present his first major solo exhibition in Australia at the Museum of Contemporary Art Australia.

NYE harbour disaster

MEETINGS & Events Australia has distanced itself from the organisers of the New Year's Eve 'Above the Harbour' event.

Customers who paid up to \$500 to attend the event in the Royal Botanic Gardens have taken to Facebook to complain about a two and a half hour wait for below par food, long toilet queues and a DJ who blasted Bieber on repeat.

MEA has issued a statement clarifying that the event organiser is not a MEA member.

Organisers have responded to criticism, saying they "greatly regret that a number of patrons have complained" and admitting there was a backlog at certain points of "people wanting to access services and facilities".

The caterer for the event, Shangri La Hotel later said they attempted to create complex dishes which "were difficult to produce at the speed required".

OTP for top conven cities

copenhagen is the city delegates travelling by air are most likely to arrive ontime for meetings and conventions in 2015, according to the OAG's Punctuality League 2015 report.

The report ranked the top global meeting and conventions cities, based on the number of meetings held in each city in 2014 and compared this with the average On Time Performance (OTP) in 2015 for the city's airlines and

airports.

Denmark's capital had an average OTP of 88.53%, followed by Berlin (86.29%), Vienna (85.12%) and Singapore (84.75%).

The report emphasised the role OTP plays in a seamless event - if delegates arrive late, they lose part of the value of the event and if they depart late, they miss out on time with their family and friends.
