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MONA REVEALS EVENTS VISION

TASMANIA'S Museum of Old and New Art (Mona) will target the conference and events sector as part of a \$300 million hotel plan.

The headlinegrabbing museum's founder David Walsh has unveiled designs for a 172-room five-star hotel called HOMO (HOtel MOna), perched dramatically over the Derwent River outside Hobart.

As well as a spa, library and art collection, the hotel will offer a dedicated function and events centre with capacity for dinners of up to 800 people and cocktail receptions for up to 1,000.

An indoor theatre will cater to music, plays, cinema, conferences and business



launches, with seating for 1,075.

"We expect HOMO to be attractive to large segments of the national and international business and conference markets that previously haven't turned to Tasmania due to a lack of appropriate infrastructure," Walsh said.

"New facilities, like the auditorium and theatre, will also allow us to further activate the site at night and continue to diversify the appeal of Mona to Tasmanians too."

Once approved, construction is expected to take three years, with opening slated for 2022.

MCEC CHIEF TO AIPC

MELBOURNE Convention and Exhibition Centre (MCEC) chief executive Peter King has been appointed to the International Association of Convention Centres' (AIPC) board of directors during its 2017 General Assembly held in Sydney last week.
