## New Minister

# MELB STILL BRAVE AFTER C2 LOSS

**MELBOURNE'S** conference sector has vowed to continue taking risks in pursuit of innovation and disruption, despite the cancellation of the C2 Melbourne conference.

The Oct event had been expected to attract up to 3,000 delegates for a creative business event based around "inspiring talks, collaborative workshops, experiential brainstorming sessions, performances and festivities".

However organisers this week confirmed the Melbourne event - initially planned for 2017 and postponed to this year - would now be dropped to allow a focus on the established C2 event in Montreal in May.

"While we demonstrated our deep commitment to bringing C2 Melbourne to life, a series of circumstances outside of our control made it impossible for us to execute on the creation of the event," said C2 International president and chief executive officer Richard St-Pierre.

The organisation would not



elaborate on the reasons for the cancellation, but said all ticket holders would be refunded.

A Victorian Government spokesman said no taxpayer money had been lost as a result of the cancellation.

"This is unfortunate news, but the closure of C2 Melbourne is a company decision," he said.

Melbourne Convention Bureau ceo Karen Bolinger said the decision to enter into a relationship with C2 had been "about being brave, innovative and trying new things".

"Whilst we are surprised and disappointed to have received the news of the cancellation of C2 Melbourne, we have

been advised that it is in the best interests of Melbourne, our stakeholders, partners and prospective attendees," she said.

"We will continue to take risks and seek out opportunities for innovation and disruption in the conference market."

Melbourne Convention & Exhibition Centre ceo Peter King said the centre was currently assessing the prospect of an ongoing partnership with C2 International.

The centre was the host venue for the event and had also announced a partnership in which "Signature C2 Labs" and experiences would be available to other event organisers.

## STAR EXPANDS IN QLD

**THE** Dorsett brand is set to enter the Australian market in early 2022 with The Star Gold Coast breaking ground on a \$400m development which will house the brand’s first hotel in Australia.

“The introduction of a Dorsett hotel will bring with it increased awareness in the global market, especially in Asia, where Dorsett Hospitality International owns and operates the majority of its 54 hotels,” said Star Entertainment Group chairman John O’Neill.

## WA: CROWN TOWERS PERTH

### venue spotlight

**AS PERTH** gears up to host a string of high-profile events including next year’s 40th annual Australian Tourism Exchange, many of the city’s top venues are getting ready to take their own place in the international spotlight.

Among them is Crown Towers Perth which has quickly become one of the city’s favourite event locations since its opening in late 2016.

The 500-room luxury property is the largest hotel in the city and overlooks the Perth skyline from its position on the banks of the Swan River.

It adjoins sister hotels Crown Metropal and Crown Promenade in the wider Crown Entertainment Complex, home to the city’s casino and a string of high-profile restaurants including Rockpool Bar & Grill, Bistro Guillaume and Nobu.

The property also boasts the largest event spaces of any Perth hotel, with capacity to host up to 3,000 delegates.

Among its facilities is the 2,000m<sup>2</sup> Crown Ballroom which can host 1,560 people in banquet format, or be divided

into combinations of smaller spaces of between 230m<sup>2</sup> and 1,300m<sup>2</sup>.

Alongside is the 1,850m<sup>2</sup> Grand Ballroom with banqueting capacity for up to 1,200 people, which can also be divided into two spaces of 925m<sup>2</sup> each.

A series of other event spaces range from 89m<sup>2</sup> to 1,000m<sup>2</sup> and can be configured in theatre, classroom, boardroom, dining or cocktail formats, while a series of four divisible meeting rooms have up to 97m<sup>2</sup> of space.

One of the property’s highlights is its Great Lawn, an outdoor space with sweeping views, ideal for cocktails, concerts, charity events and galas.

Other facilities include the hotel’s Crystal Club private lounge on the 15th floor and the Crown Spa.

The hotel’s events team can also arrange activities from team-building



exercises and cooking classes to day visits to Rottnest Island or local wineries. See [www.crownperth.com.au](http://www.crownperth.com.au).
